Thais Focus on Border Tensions, Cabinet Reshuffle, and Cash Handout

The issue that received the most attention from the respondents was the Thai-Cambodian border situation (40.97%), followed by the Cabinet reshuffle (17.05%), and the 10,000-baht cash handout policy (16.24%). Other issues of interest included the 12-million-baht cash found near a trash bin (13.91%) and arsenic contamination in the Kok River (11.83%). The poll results show that public interest spans across topics related to national security, the economy, politics, and the environment. In particular, news that directly affects daily life and the sense of safety—such as the border conflict and environmental contamination—draws strong attention. At the same time, political developments and government policies remain under close watch, as they have a direct impact on people's livelihoods and overall trust in the government

Border, Cabinet Key to Government Stability

The respondents viewed the Thai-Cambodian border situation as the issue most likely to affect the government's stability (42.70%), followed by the Cabinet reshuffle (30.51%) and the 10,000-baht cash handout policy (10.98%). Other notable issues included the Entertainment Complex project (8.76%) and the U.S. agreement to tax negotiations with Thailand (7.05%). This part of the poll reflects that national security and internal government management are key factors shaping public perception of political stability. In particular, the border tension and Cabinet restructuring may become turning points if not handled effectively. At the same time, populist policies and issues related to ethical leadership remain sensitive matters that require careful management.

The hottest issue capturing nationwide attention in Thailand is the ThaiCambodian border situation. Beyond concerns about the threat of war and the
safety of both soldiers and civilians along the border, public interest appears to be
driven by dissatisfaction with the Thai government's response. Many perceive the
government's stance as too conciliatory toward Cambodia, lacking firm and
decisive action, which has sparked widespread concern. This situation has ignited
a wave of patriotism and unity, with the public rallying behind the soldiers
stationed at the border. Their efforts are seen as essential to defending the
nation's sovereignty, restoring some level of public trust in frontline operations.
At the same time, the government's handling of the border conflict and the delays
in implementing the 10,000-baht handout policy have led to growing discontent.
Certain ministers have become unpopular, facing public criticism and backlash.
With these issues mounting, all eyes are now on the government to see how,
following the Cabinet reshuffle, it will attempt to restore public support
and regain the confidence of the people.
